





Dear Parents, Guardians and Learners,

There are two phases for CCA sign-ups. The first phase will allow learners (or parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 4) to select up to 5 CCAs in order of preference. Please select CCAs that your child will commit to for the whole season. The system will then randomly allocate places. **There is no advantage to selecting early in this process.**

Due to the length of the school day CCAs are not available for Nursery learners.

Kindergarten learners will only be assigned one CCA per week.

Year 1 will be allocated up to 2 CCAs (1 CCA, 1 paid CCA).

All learners from Year 2 will be assigned up to a maximum of 4 CCAs, (2 CCAs, 2 paid CCAs) depending on the popularity of the CCAs.

Key Dates & Times

Phase 1 will open at 9.00am on 18 November 2016 and will remain open for FOUR DAYS, closing on 22 November 2016 at 9.00am. Once the initial allocations have been made CHQ will re-open at 6.00pm on the 22nd and close again on 24 November at 9.00am. This is when all remaining CCA places will be allocated. Season Two runs from 28 November 2016 to 11 February 2017 (8 weeks).

Participation In CCA Sessions & Events

Please take time to read over the various activities on offer and discuss with your child which CCAs they would like to commit to. We strongly encourage every learner to commit to at least one CCA each season and also to take part in at least one voluntary event a year.

CCAs run over three seasons to match the ACSIS sports seasons, but do not run during school or public holidays.

If you wish to continue a CCA from Season One that is part of an ongoing course such as Karate, Taekwondo, Ballet, Piano Intermediate and Race Car Engineering Intermediate, you must select this CCA as one of your choices and a higher priority will be given to you.

Additional Lunch-Time & After-School Activities

Maker Space

The Nexus Maker Space gives learners the opportunity to turn ideas into physical artifacts. With 3D design, printing, robotics, lazer cutting and an array of other tools, projects extend learning beyond the classroom. As a flexible learning space, the Maker Space is open for project based experiential learning at lunchtimes and after school.

The Primary Maker Space is open at lunchtimes. Teachers along with Year 6 learners provide support on the following days:

The Secondary Maker Space is open each lunchtime on a first come first served basis for all Secondary learners.

After school the Maker Space is open for any learners with ongoing projects. We encourage them to inform Mr Bailey in advance if they intend to come along.



School Council

Please be aware that if your child is absent or a paid CCA is cancelled by the school due to unforeseen circumstances e.g. haze or adverse weather, there will be no 'make-up' class or reimbursement. This also applies to school trips and camps.

Nexus International School (Singapore) is a member school of Athletic Conference of Singapore International Schools (ACSIS). ACSIS provides learners with an opportunity to compete in an inter-school athletic programme. The academic year is divided into three sporting seasons. Each season offers different sports across various age categories in which our learners may participate. Sports offered each season, all results, divisions, member schools, age categories, sport rules and additional information can be found on the ACSIS website www.acsis.com.sg.

Learners should be present at the dedicated location at the appropriate date/time according to the schedule for trainings.

Due to the nature of ACSIS Season Two fixtures this academic year, training sessions for sport teams will begin two weeks prior to the School CCA season to prepare teams for the upcoming season and to determine match schedule so parents can make accurate CCA choices. ACSIS Season Two sport team training sessions began week of Monday, 7 November and will follow the schedule presented below. These days and times will then become the regular training days for these teams.

Please keep in mind when making other CCA choices that our ACSIS Season Two Sport teams will also have fixtures/matches that will also need to taken into consideration when making your selections. Team will receive schedule during the week Monday, 14 November through Friday, 18 November.

All learners who sign up for a sport team will be given the opportunity to train with the squad on the regular training day. However, if numbers are large, team selection for fixtures will be done on a weekly basis. Fixtures for ACSIS Season Two will begin for some teams from the week beginning Monday, 21 November.

How To Get Involved?

There are no trials for sports teams and we encourage all learners to go along to training and try new sports, but please be aware of the age restrictions for each team. Sport administrators will manually upload learners names onto the CHQ portal.
