Book Week: Heroes And Villains, 4 - 8 March 2013

Book Week is here again to help us all celebrate reading for pleasure. So do please get involved and help your child to discover their love of reading. A full timetable of events can be found on the [Nexus Loves Reading](#) website.

Studies show that children who enjoy and feel confident reading are better learners. Reading helps them discover the world. A strong reading habit - whether they enjoy books, comics or digital technology - will help them grasp other subjects, from history to science to maths to music. With this year's theme of Heroes & Villains, there's something for everybody to enjoy. So join in!

Here's How:

1. **Have a chat:** Everyone has a hero or a favourite villain, whether they're from books, comics, history, sport, films or even computer games. So probably the best and fastest way to take part in Book Week is simply to talk to your child. Why not ask them about the heroes that have inspired them? Or tell them about a person or character that made a big impression

on you? You could even turn it into an activity by watching a film, reading together, dressing up or going on an outing.

2. **Come along to a book event from March 4 – 8:** Check out the timetable of events from the [Nexus Loves Reading](#) website. There will be guest authors, a book fair, a costume parade and more.

3. **Try some reading tips:**

Read aloud to each other. It's a great chance to share something special, talk and be close.

Choose books that suit their interests. Comic books, dancing or football - whatever your child's passion, go with it.

Don't get frustrated. If your child wants to read the same thing over and over, that's fine. What matters is that they love reading.

Keep lots of books around the house!

Ask a teacher, a librarian or someone who works in a bookshop. They love to talk about good books if you're stuck.

- Schedule time everyday for your child to do homework and provide a quiet place, free from distractions, where your child can work
- Make reading part of your child's daily routine. Parents can read to their children in either English or their native language
- Talking in your mother tongue about what your child has learnt in his/her lessons will not only encourage conversational skills but also gives the child an opportunity to express any problems and /or frustrations he/she may be encountering at school
- Be sure to attend parent-teacher conferences scheduled by the school
- The key to success in obtaining a new language lies in permanent collaboration in an atmosphere of mutual respect, trust and encouragement between the ELS teacher, homeroom teacher, parents/guardians and the student
- Encouragement is crucial for the development of a new language

SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS

English

Last week Grade 7 and Grade 8 learners were deciding on how to proceed with their final 21st century classroom design presentations for [The Octopus's Garden Project](#). Lots of critical thinking happened as learners made important decisions about how teams would be formed, how the presentation would work, what would be included, and the order each section would occur in. Learners recognised that these thinking, planning and linking skills are essential in effectively and clearly presenting all their designs in a cohesive manner, but are also very important for organising their writing. Science Department Working With Primary Pupils

On Thursday, the Science Department hosted our Grade 1 learners who came to investigate the building blocks of life using microscopes. After getting used to working with microscopes, they began to use the instrument to look at pieces of paper and coins. The learners then moved on to looking at pieces of onion and some pre-prepared slides of plant and animal parts. Teachers used smartphones to capture some of the amazing images that the pupils produced; these photographs will be used in follow-up work.

Grade 5 learners who are preparing for their PYP Final Project sought advice from the science department by organising a meeting in which to discuss possible ways to model a tsunami. Many ideas were generated and the science department looks forward to working with these learners to bring some of these ideas to fruition over the next few weeks.

Grade 7 Health And Physical Education

Grade 7 Physical Education learners have impressed this term. Their land based PE focus was 'social responsibility' using the sport of Floorball – which is a gymnasium version of ice hockey.

Learners were divided into three even mixed ability teams, and these teams were maintained for the duration of the unit. Each team member then chose an on-going team role to perform; coach, manager, captain, equipment monitor, first aid, team player. These teams were responsible for undertaking their own Floorball training sessions before learning to play various methods of tournament play (round robin, league, knock-out, drop off).

ICT was integrated into the learning through team training planning sessions, where team members collaborated to research useful drills, tactics, and techniques of Floorball.



Teams also learnt the structure of a training sessions and what is involved for each component. Learners had to demonstrate time management to fit warm-up, technique development, skills and drills, mini games, and warm down into the training sessions.

All Grade 7 learners have stepped up superbly, and I was amazed at the high level of social responsibility demonstrated by all.
